College and Hospital is an educational institution that has been formed with the authorization of the Maharashtra State and Central government, under the administration and Welfare Trust. The institution follows the curriculum established by the Central Council of Homoeopathy. The college is associated with the Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik. The institute's infrastructure and teaching-learning facilities are regulated by the rules, standards, and guidelines set out by the Central Council of Homoeopathy in New Delhi. The college has established a College Council and other appropriate entities to implement the strategic plan. The College Council meeting is held at the start of the academic year to establish the strategic plan for execution throughout the year. The meeting is chaired by the Principal, who also serves as the secretary of the council. The conference is attended by the Heads of the undergraduate and postgraduate faculties, who serve as members of the College Council. The college's academic, co-curricular, and extracurricular events are deliberated over at the meeting, and the Academic Calendar planner is then established. The council convenes periodically to assess the execution of the Academic planner and deliberates on any additional issues that may emerge throughout the given timeframe. The academic activities are overseen by the academic responsible for the individual courses in collaboration with the department heads. The different committees are responsible for implementing the co-curricular and extracurricular activities. The college has established an Unfair Means Committee to investigate any anomalies or instances of unfair practices that may occur during academic activities, particularly exams. The cultural committee organizes yearly events, including an induction program for newly enrolled students and a graduation ceremony for departing interns.

The Anti Ragging committee organizes the sensitization campaign at the start of each school year. The Internal Complaints Committee is responsible for addressing the complaints received from students, teachers, and parents. The institution has established the Institutional Ethics Committee, which evaluates research proposals presented by students and interns who are passionate about research. If the proposals meet the stipulated standards, the committee provides authorization to perform the study.
